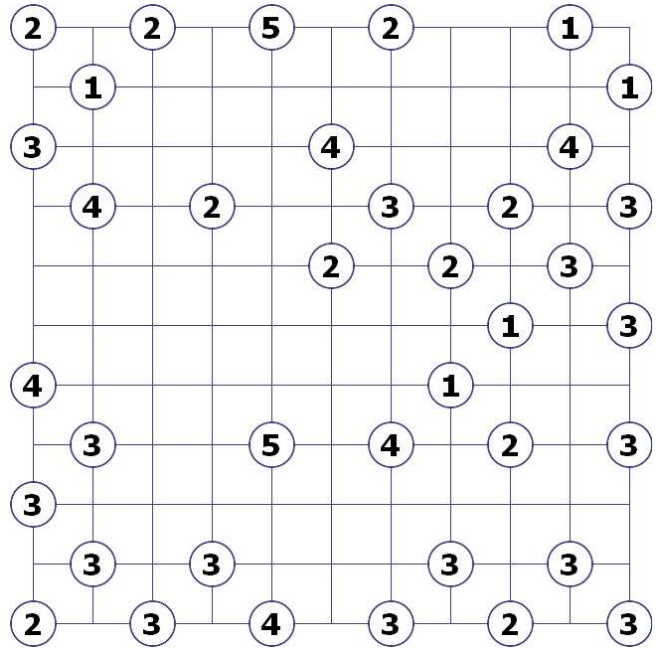
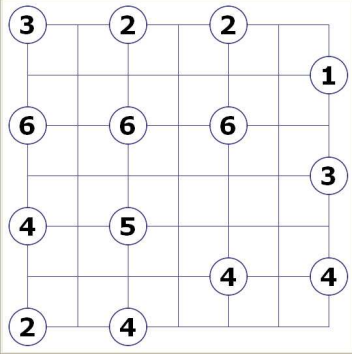

Easy Hashi

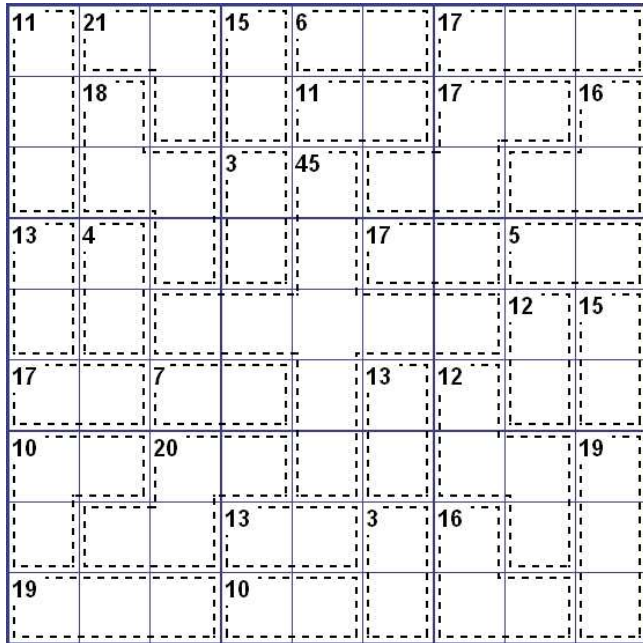

- 2) No more than 2 bridges can emanate in one direction from an island.

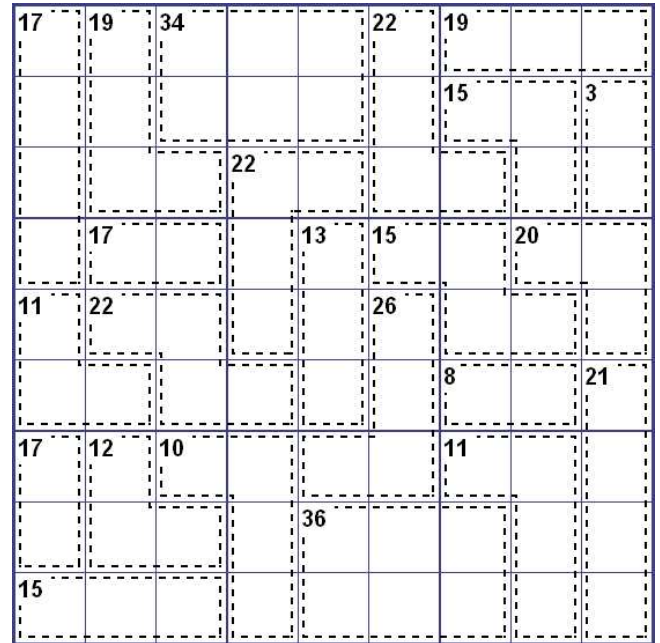

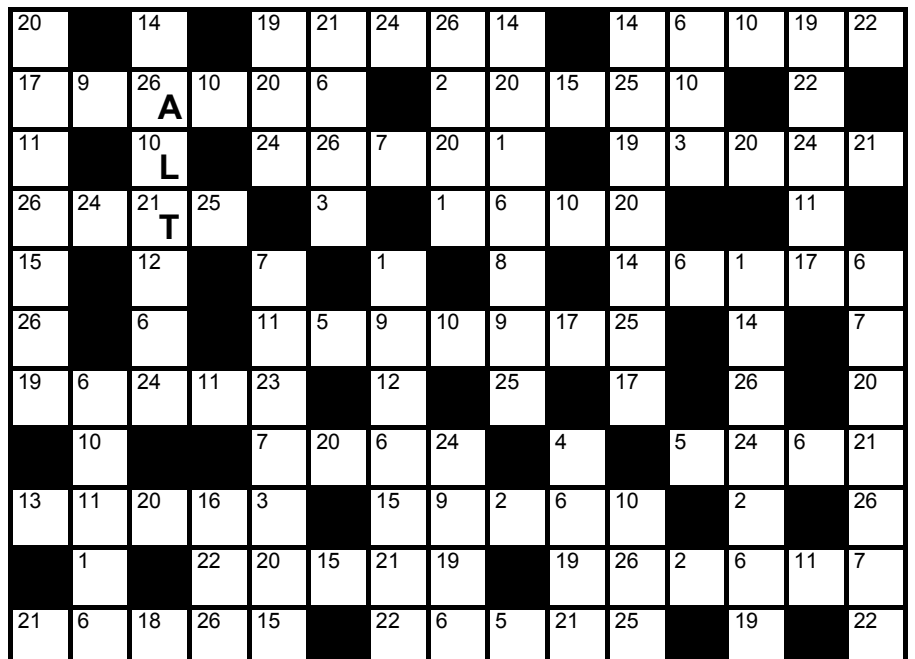

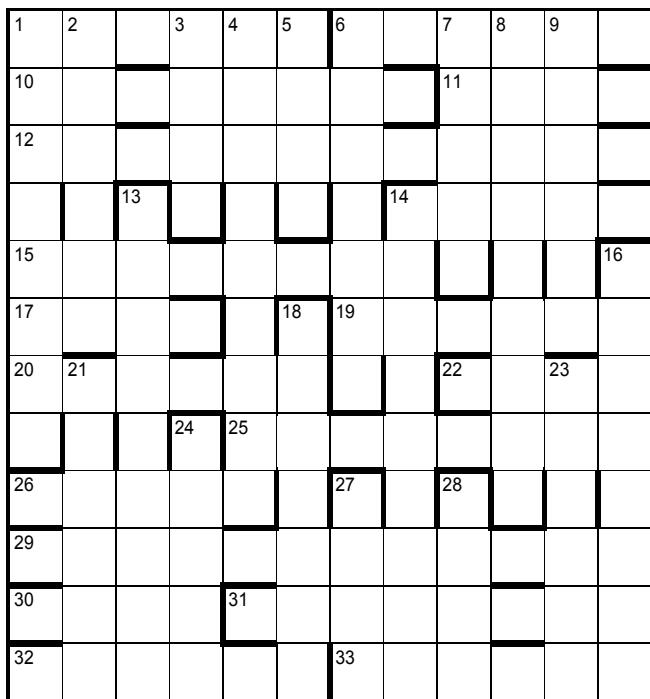

Wordplay for these clues refers to uncoded versions. From each Down answer a letter should be removed (wherever it appears) - taken in order, these letters form three parts of the theme. Wordplay and enumerations for these clues refers to grid entries. Chambers 2008 is the primary reference other than for proper nouns.

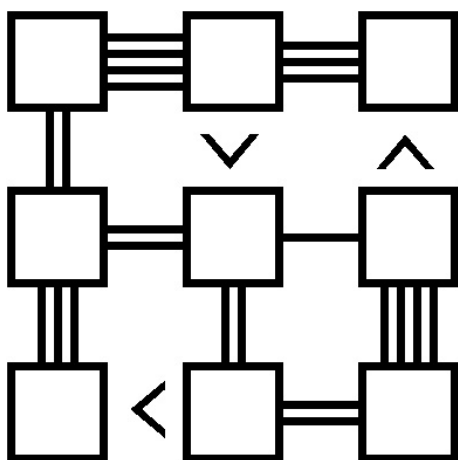
